

- Registration is for life and all fees paid are due once only during ownership of your Brumby.
- DNA hair samples must be provided on application for registration. Information for applicants to the methodology of our requirements for SMBR Registration Inclusion. The SMBR hope to have in the future an online data base where all will be able to search for information and history on our Snowy Mountains Brumby. The SMBR will be sponsoring shows and encourage owners to participate in open classes where ever possible.

<u>DNA Collection details</u>. Part mane or tail and pull 20 or more hairs, place in a plastic snap lock bag and include with documents. Hair must have root ball, so we ask that you handle the hair with care. Please do not touch the hair follicles.
